

Frantic Artists @ PREVIEW BERLIN ART FAIR 2013

Frantic Gallery returns in Berlin for this year edition of young and ambitious PREVIEW BERLIN Art Fair and we are happy to be a part of Berlin Art Week 2013 with numerous events and international guests in the city. While the highlight of this year art week will be "Painting Forever!" - a line of exhibitions dedicated to subject of painting in Berlin - Frantic Gallery will present four of Japanese artists who work in the same field and illustrate a vast variety of approaches applied for creation of painterly expressions.

Cousteau Tazuke will be showing for the first time his screens, paintings made with acrylic resin and paint, which are installed on the metal base in the way both front and back side of the painting can be seen, thus transforming the topology of this traditionally two-dimensional art. With PREVIEW BERLIN Art Fair 2013 we are happy to announce our first collaboration with Atsushi Koyama, the artist who works on topic of ManMachine and uses oil on canvas to create "metaphysical" sketches of mechanical apparatus merging it with the physics of human body. After his solo show in Tokyo early this year Haruki Ogawa will be showing the "accumulation spreads", in which his revolting images come out with more complicated structures while expanding to new media. Finally, Norio Kawamura will present his "nocturnal objects", vast planes of black reliefs made of glue and lacquer, showing his research of dark color effects and interplay of smooth lacquer and excitation of the surface in the forms of butterflies.

Cousteau Tazuke

Tazuke carves into clear acrylic panels, pours acid-colored paint in the resulting cavities and then exhibits these works backwards, thus subverting the opposition of the front and the rear -- the positive and negative -- of the picture and transcending the borderline between the process of carving and the work of drawing, the art of sculpture and that of painting. This time the artist uses aluminium leaf for some of the recent works. Referring to Japanese tradition of golden and silver leaf, which was far more than simply a decorative element, dazzling metal overcomes its "reality of being a material" and injects the "limitlessness" into the work.

"Aluminium leaf"-related works we will be shown with Tazuke's pieces dedicated to The Grid and geometrical patterns, combining "geometry" and "abstraction", "boundlessness" and "grasped spaces" of his works in a single presentation.























Atsushi Koyama


A machine – the simplest rotating devices of mechanical nature – come apart and expands on black background of Koyma's canvases while parts of human body gently and with care hold, elevate or support the running parts. The Mechanism unfolds in human's hands overcoming its utilitarian or even material nature and while generating aesthetical strength goes beyond the material. As a particular visualization of METAMACHINE Koyama's devices transform and regenerate themselves into medium with access to supernatural dimension, as a mega-key to the parallel world where machine have same rights for beauty and sublime as human body in ours.




Atsushi Koyama, Undefined 1, oil on canvas, 130x97cm, 2013 (details)




Atsushi Koyama, Undefined 02, oil on canvas, 97x130.3cm, 2013







Atsushi Koyama, Undefined 02, oil on canvas, 97x130.3cm, 2013 (details)

Haruki Ogawa

As vast and random accumulations of fast decaying objects Haruki Ogawa's works strike with synchronous appearance of dynamic and visually intense elements. His paintings with its expanding drive overcome traditional for fine art oppositions of "main and secondary", "figure and background", "material and formal" and being featured by "three-dimensional abstraction" shake the definition of "non-figurative" expressions itself.













Haruki Ogawa, Object # 4, mixed media, H9.6xW9.6xD10cm, 2011






Norio Kawamura

Norio Kawamura uses glue and lacquer to create nocturnal images with no figures, breathing fields of picturesque darkness.

His works offer double directed movement. From the picture, a dominative BLACK slides out from the base, acting as Night that overcomes its frame, as Death that breaks its enclosure and splashes out into the locus of the viewer. In the meantime, the onlooker, while being confronted by a patch of Darkness that envelops and drags him into it, gradually slides into a bottomless Nothing. The medium is The Butterfly. A symbolic insect able to glide between Life and Death, Day and Night, Consciousness and Insanity, comes to the surface of black lacquer as if repeatedly gaining its shape and then losing its form again melting back into morbid gloss.







Norio Kawamura, Inner Catastrophe, glue/synthetic lacquer, 110x160x10cm, 2012
